

## *The Spirit of Anne Frank Awards 1997 winners*

### *1997 Outstanding Youth Award*

MAX WEISMAN is a graduate of Ramapo High School. He was a peer trainer for the Anti-Defamation League's, "A World of Difference" Institute. Weisman has led workshops for hundreds of students, faculty and administrators.

### *1997 Outstanding Youth Award*

TERRELL DILLARD was a pre-engineering junior and student organization president at A. Philip Randolph High School. He is a peer mediator, counselor for younger children and a role model.

### *1997 Outstanding Youth Award*

THE FREEDOM WRITERS are 150 inner-city teenagers from Long Beach, CA whose involvement with Anne Frank's story set them on a path that will include college enrollment as well as community activism. They have compiled their own journal of hardship, discrimination and loss, entitled *An American Diary: Voices of an Undeclared War*.

### *1997 Outstanding Educator Award*

DR. LEONARD H. GOLUBCHIK is principal of Manhattan's School for Technology and the Arts. Through a partnership with Henry Street Settlement, the school uses art and drama to raise issues of cultural diversity and to teach peer mediation and conflict resolution. Golubchick introduced a Holocaust curriculum into the sixth grade.

### *1997 Outstanding Educator Award*

STUART ELENKO is founder and director of the Holocaust Museum, Bronx High School of Science, one of the nation's first such museums when it was established in 1976. That same year, Elenko started the first Holocaust History class in a U.S. high school and produced the nation's first student educational guide on the Holocaust.

### *1997 Outstanding Citizen Award*

SANFORD CLOUD is the first African-American President & CEO of the National Conference of Christians and Jews. The Conference sponsored a "National Conversation on Race, Ethnicity and Culture: Perspectives in the Workplace," which is now sponsoring local discussions in communities throughout the United States. Cloud served as a member of President Carter's delegation that oversaw the first Palestinian elections.

### *1997 Outstanding Business & Community Leaders*

BARBARA RILEY LEVIN and GERALD M. LEVIN  
Mrs. Levin actively supports programs that benefit the needy, the community and the arts. She serves as a distinguished member of many Boards and in 1994, chaired "Let's Make Sure Everybody Eats" Telethon to end hunger. Mr. Levin, the Chairman and CEO of Time Warner, Inc., is a member of the board of A Living Memorial to the Holocaust - Museum of Jewish Heritage, the New York Partnership, and New York Philharmonic.
