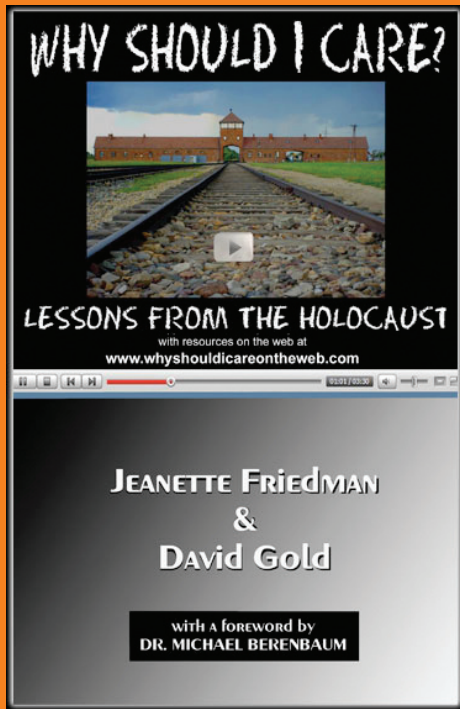

AUTHOR JEANETTE FRIEDMAN will read from her book and discuss its implications. *Why Should I Care? Lessons from the Holocaust* uses a new approach to Holocaust and Genocide Studies that engages teenagers in their communities using a frame of reference including clips from *Star Trek* and a song from the film *Borat* to help them understand the context of their character.

Friedman and co-author David Gold assert that children and adolescents cannot relate to the story of the Holocaust writ large. Rather, the authors believe that the purpose of Holocaust and Genocide Studies should be to focus on how people treat each other in their own neighborhoods and how individuals have a profound effect on global society.
