An Invitation to Become a Speaker at The Anne Frank Center USA

This is an invitation for Holocaust survivors and their families to share their personal story of courage and resiliency with NYC students in grades 5 through 12. Holocaust stories help today's young people connect with the devastation of stereotyping, scapegoating and discrimination and teach the importance of standing up against intolerance in all its forms. The Anne Frank Center honors these special stories as gifts each and every time they are told.

The Anne Frank Center program is 90 minutes. The program begins with a talk about Anne Frank as a role model for today. Students watch a 26 minute video called *The Short Life of Anne Frank*, and then meet a Holocaust survivor or a survivor's family member to hear a personal story, followed by a Q & A.

All programs take place at the Anne Frank Center, 44 Park Place, which is easily accessible by many subways. The speaker's story is approximately 20 minutes. Students and teachers like to ask questions afterwards. Unfortunately, at this time, we are not able to pay for this service: becoming a speaker is a volunteer position at the Center. We ask that speakers make a commitment to speaking at least four times per year.

The Anne Frank Center USA, a partner organization of the Anne Frank House, uses the diary and spirit of Anne Frank as unique tools to advance her legacy, to educate young people and communities about the consequences of intolerance, racism and discrimination, and to inspire the next generation to build a world based on mutual respect.
